ABOUT BRANDON CENTRE

Brandon Centre has been a trailblazer in adolescent mental health services for over 50 years. Today, we're a well-known and much-appreciated source of support for many young people in and around North London.

Based in a welcoming Georgian house - donated to us by Brandon Cadbury - in the heart of Kentish Town, we offer all young people a safe and non-judgmental place to access counselling, psychotherapy and coaching.

We also offer family support services and work in the community with youth hubs and other local organisations including Arsenal in the Community, University College London, Islington Giving, HandsOn London, Primary Care and local schools and colleges.

Now, more than ever, young people need our support. With 75% of lifetime mental illness first experienced before age 20, we offer critical support at a critical time.

As the organisation grows, we want to support more young people, in particular those who have been historically more difficult to reach.

THE BRANDON CENTRE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

We currently have eight Trustees with our existing Treasurer due to step down at the end of July. We will be recruiting a further five new Trustees which will take the total number to 12. Trustees meet regularly at our quarterly Board and each Trustee supports one of our Committees; Finance, Quality Safety & Risk, Business Development & Fundraising, and People. Trustees support Brandon Centre between meetings where possible. The Board also meets twice a year at Board Away Days which allow time for reflection and planning.

It's important to us that our Board represents the diverse communities in which we work and is able to contribute a range of different skills and experiences.

TRUSTEE DUTIES

The Board of Trustees approves and safeguards the charity's strategy, must always act in the best interests of Brandon Centre, and must act as a group and not as individuals.

Brandon Centre's Senior Leadership Team is on hand to support the Board's decision-making by providing papers before each meeting of the Board of Trustees. The Chief Executive and Senior Leadership Team will always be available to answer any questions that you might have.

Your overarching duties will be to ensure that Brandon Centre:

- complies with its governing document, charity law, company law and any other relevant legislation or regulations;
- pursues its objects as defined in its governing document; and
- applies its resources exclusively in pursuance of its objects;



As a Trustee you will:

- contribute actively to the Board of Trustees by giving sound strategic direction;
- together with the leadership team, set overall policy, define goals and targets, and evaluate performance;
- ensure the financial stability and sustainability of Brandon Centre;
- safeguard the good name and values of Brandon Centre; and
- monitor the performance of the CEO and if necessary, appoint a new CEO.

We encourage Trustees to use any specific skills, knowledge, or experience to help the Board reach sound decisions. This may involve leading discussions, identifying key issues, providing guidance on new initiatives, evaluating recommendations from other parties, or offering advice on any area in which the Trustee has a particular expertise.

MARK BLAND, BRANDON CENTRE CHAIR

Mark has been a Brandon Centre Trustee since 2019 and our Chair since 2021. He has worked in education for over 20 years, including 10 years as a Headteacher at a North London Secondary School. He's also worked on a number of local authority Boards in the areas of special needs, school finance and social mobility. Mark has a deep understanding of the social issues and challenges facing young people today.

Julia has been Brandon Centre's CEO since 2019. Her background in healthcare management and commissioning, together with her hands-on experience as Nurse, Midwife and Health Visitor means Julia is as comfortable with the day-to-day operations at Brandon Centre as she is giving strategic direction. Julia is herself a Trustee and School Governor and is also a qualified Executive and Therapeutic Wellbeing Coach.

- 5. Increase awareness and reach of our services through effective communications and marketing.
